Junior IAPS

For many the Junior IAPS was their first taste of serious athletics competition. Challenging yourself against the best in Sussex is hard enough, doing it in 32 degrees heat is an even harder proposition. All our athletes performed admirably. Poppy J showed true grit throughout, qualifying for 3 finals on the day. Lydia O proved herself to be an ever improving high jumper finishing in an impressive 3rd place. The long distance events were unfortunately run in the middle of the day with temperatures peaking. Daniel A and Holly L battled exceptionally hard to record fantastic 3rd place in the 600m and 1500m respectively. The highlight of the day was undoubtedly the boys 1500m event. Luke D won the event last year (running up a year) in a record time of 5 mins 23 secs. This year he came back to defend his title. He did so in style smashing his own record by a massive 13 secs. So impressive was his run that the organisers voted him the athlete of the day for his category. I must say a huge thank you to all the pupils for their behaviour, determination and positivity throughout. You were all a credit and the future looks bright for Hazelwood Athletics team.

Senior IAPS

A mere 4 days after the Junior IAPS we returned to the track. This time with our senior team and the incentive of reaching the national finals in Birmingham for those who finished 1st or 2nd in their events. If we thought the future looked bright after the Junior event, the present looks even brighter. The day started with a bang (excuse the pun) as we had 3 separate 1500m runners in action. Hannah R, Luke D and Oscar P all competed with distinction, all finishing 2nd in tough races. Oscar ran a controlled race, always looking certain to qualify. Hannah went off like a rocket, had a mid race wobble, fell (literally) got overtaken on the last

lap but still battled back for 2nd. True grit. Luke fought the whole race with two other exceptional runners. As they reached the final bend all three were neck and neck (and neck). At the line only a second separated them with Luke sandwiched between the other boys. In a fair world all three would have made it through to the national finals such was their strength in performance.

The hurdles were next up. Our morning got even better as 5 out of the 6 competitors forced their way through to the regional finals. In the finals themselves, Daniel H ran an exceptional race finishing in a brilliant 3rd position. Oscar A-L went one better and secured 2nd place and our fourth athlete to qualify for Birmingham.

We had some excellent performances in the field events. Marcus L, James M, Freya D, Max E, Joe Mc, Fred W, Edward M and Jaden O'N showing that with a little extra hard work they could make significant progress. It was however Lucy L and Jas F who stole the show. Lucy threw 8.15m in the Shot. This is well under her best but still enough to win the event by over 1m and set a new IAPS record. Jas F was not to be outdone, she also set a new IAPS record in the high jump recording a height of 1.37m jumping a full 7cm higher than her nearest rival. Two regional winners and two more into the national finals.

Jas F not happy with just one victory was determined to leave the event as double champion. She did exactly that. In the 200m event Jas has run three consecutive 30.01sec times including her IAPS heat. Historically competitors run slower in the final due to exhaustion but Jas broke with tradition and recorded a time of 29.57 secs to take the victory.



At the beginning of the day I set out my target for this talented group. I had predicted we were capable of reaching the finals in 8 events. We had fallen just short with 7 but could be extremely happy with our day's work. The following day news filtered through that Thomas H had become our 8th finalist. Thomas finished the 200m event in 3rd place but has been upgraded to 2nd and hence makes the bus to Birmingham. This is just reward for the effort Thomas puts in to each session. Thomas is a sportsman and a gentleman. On receiving the news his reaction was one of joy but also sorrow that the other boy was to miss out (due to unavailability) when he had performed so well. The Hazelwood spirit lives strong.

We now move on to the finals in Birmingham with a school record of 7 pupils competing in 8 separate events when I hope to bring you even more good news. Well done to all.


Art

I try not to worry what time I spend.




Games




